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FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

February 2026

Lent begins in February of this year with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a season of forty days of repentance and fasting to help us prepare for Easter. Sundays are not counted because they are considered to be “mini-celebrations” of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. On Ash Wednesday we receive dust and ashes on our foreheads. By doing this we remember that we will return to dust and ashes, and so we repent, and we offer gratitude that, through Jesus’ death and resurrection, God offers us forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. The origins of the word *Lent* include a cluster of Old English and Germanic words that point to the lengthening days of spring. Longer days means springtime, and spring means newness of life—the dead days of winter are on their way out and Resurrection is coming!

In the Bible, the number forty is highly symbolic for prayer, sacrifice, sober thought, and preparation. Remember, in the story of Noah and the ark, the rain fell for forty days and forty nights (Genesis 7:12). Moses and the people of Israel were forty years in the wilderness—often with only manna from heaven to eat as they journeyed toward the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 8:3; 29:5-6). Jesus began His ministry by going into the wilderness for forty days, praying hard, fasting to the point of death, preparing for His ministry and confronting Satan’s temptations (Matthew 4:1-11).

During the season of Lent, we set aside time during our fasting to read the Scriptures, pray, study, and discuss our Lord’s saving ministry. During this Lenten season, especially during our midweek services, we will focus on the closing days of our Lord’s words and work. We will begin when Jesus closed His work in Galilee; went on to a mountainside with Peter, James, and John; prayed almost all night; then “set his face to Jerusalem.” We will carefully ponder that critical decision—and decide how we might make life-determining decisions about where we set our faces. We will observe Jesus’ healings and His teachings along the way. We will be overwhelmed to visualize the huge Roman army entering Jerusalem from the west on Passover Sunday (Palm Sunday), the same day Jesus rode into the city on a little donkey. We will meditate on “The Last Supper”—thinking about times we have a “last supper” with relatives and friends. And we will experience the origin of Holy Communion. Then we will go into the Garden of Gethsemane for a night of prayer. Does Jesus really want to go through with the unbelievable pain and suffering that lay ahead? We will finish our Lenten observances by meditating on our Lord’s final words from the cross—and we will be spiritually ready for Resurrection, for a glorious, victorious Easter morning!

BOARD OF EVANGELISM

The Board met on Sunday, January 4th.

Phil-Boyd Robinson reported that the Shoebox shipment had made it to the Philippines and had been delivered. This year, the gifts had been delivered slightly different than in the past. The country had experienced a severe earthquake and then shortly after they were struck by a typhoon. Many people had lost their homes and other items. The shoeboxes were delivered in conjunction with the earthquake supplies. Many thanks to Bob H. for fixing the entry door! So very much appreciated! We were also pleased with the good turnout for the Christmas Dinner.

A list has been emailed to members to sign up for preparing the Friday meals. In place of a summer meal for the HoC friends, we will do a dinner for the volunteers who help with any aspect of HoC. This will be scheduled for some time in July (not the 4th of July weekend).

We are looking for members who would like to substitute for us in the Clothes Closet and Food Pantry. There are times when we need some

assistance on the days when open. The hours for HoC are: Tuesday: 4 PM to 6 PM and then on Thursday 10 AM to 1 PM. Please see Jennifer Wolfe or Chris Garretson if you would like to volunteer.

BOARD OF PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

Maintenance Initiatives Started or Completed

1. Mold Remediation: True North Restoration completed work Wednesday, 3 December 2025. The mold on the three large ceiling beams was removed and the beam treated and sealed. The area of mold in the rainbow classroom resulted in discovering additional water damage, from the leaking triangle window, inside the walls. They did not see any evidence of recent water damage; the triangle window was removed three years ago and the opening sealed shut. Damaged wood and sheetrock were removed and will be replaced in-house.

2. The Church Office and Education Building Sunday School classrooms HVAC systems were replaced by Climatech the week of 12 January 2026. Replacement of the three systems cost \$32,785. All the large commercial HVAC systems have now been replaced in the Sanctuary, Narthex, Social Hall, Kitchen, and Education Building. The two small HVAC systems for the Hearts of Compassion and Helping Hands workspaces have not been replaced.

Property Management Updates

1. Roof.
Diamond Roof Restorations cleaned and inspected the Silicon Sealant System on Tuesday, 9 December, as required by the warranty. They also repaired areas of the roof sealant system located above the choir loft. Otherwise, they reported that everything looked good. There was no mention of damage to the roof from turkey buzzards. We will continue to monitor the turkey buzzards.

2. Sanctuary HVAC.
Heat/Cool settings are adjusted to are 62 for heating and 74 cooling for the Narthex, and 62 for heating, and 75 for cooling for the Sanctuary. The settings were adjusted based on the current levels of humidity in the Sanctuary, 55% and Narthex, 67%. This past week, the average daily run time for the Sanctuary HVAC System was 1.6 hours; Tuesday was 3.5 hours, and Sunday was 3.6 hours. The average daily run time for the Narthex was 1.4 hours

resulting in elevated humidity readings since the HVAC System did not run enough to ensure sufficient air exchange to dehumidify the Narthex area. The desired humidity is 55%, with an acceptable range between 45% and 65%, relative humidity above 65% will engender mold and mildew.

3. Sanctuary Painting (In-house).

We have completed painting the lower walls in the Sanctuary, the Cry Room walls, and all but a small section of the Choir Room. The Narthex hallway walls are painted. The room next to the choir room was painted during the November church workday, sincere thanks to Bruce and Judy Bringman. We will start priming and painting the rest of the Narthex area in January 2026. Please contact Ed Rogers or Bob Hanovich if you are interested in priming and painting the Sanctuary. Priming and painting, except for areas above 12 feet, will be completed in-house.

4. Pest Control.

We have contracted with Preferred Pest Control to treat the outside of all structures and any indoor areas where food is stored or prepared on a bi-monthly basis.

5. Sanctuary Painting (Contracted out)

Painter recommended by Karl, was on site Monday, 6 October. They looked at the areas in the Sanctuary that require painting. The proposal will include painting the ceilings, approximately 5,000 square feet of surface, the high walls at the front of the church and back to the stained-glass window, the burgundy area behind the altar, and an option to paint the cross. Estimated cost is \$25,000.

4. Carpet Replacement

Poppell Flooring was on site Wednesday, 1 October. They are working on their proposal. Options are carpet squares and Luxury Vinyl Plank. Carpet squares cost \$52,280. Luxury Vinyl Plank cost \$67,180

Ongoing Work or Requirements

The following work list has been developed per board responsibility Church Property and Equipment - Work Lists.

1. Carpet.

The value of cleaning would be removal of dirt, bacteria, and musty smell from the carpet, but stains would remain. Our total carpeted area is around 8,000 square feet, therefore cleaning the Sanctuary and Narthex carpeting would cost between \$2,500 to \$4,000.

3. Education Building Drain Line.

The original church building, built around 1970 and the 1978 addition, the gym area, share a common drain line. The Sanctuary-Social Hall building might also use the same drain line. The plumbers think we might get another two or three years before the pipe becomes narrowed to the point where it will not drain. We will get an estimate on replacing the cast iron with PVC. The drainpipe runs from the front corner, closest to the Meditation Garden, of the Education Building to the utility hole located at the corner of Mercy and Woodley. The cost of drainpipe replacement is \$150 to \$250 linear foot, our run is around 150 feet, therefore, \$22,500 to \$37,500. Looking into reducing the cost by doing part of the work in house.

4. Other.

a. Additional stucco replacement and repairs. Four panels, not previously repaired or replaced, require replacement. Estimated cost is \$25,000.

b. Building exterior paint to seal and protect the stucco surfaces from erosion and wear. Estimated cost is \$25,000.

c. Trees on the church property will be monitored for damage or rotting. Estimated cost is \$15,000.

d. Conversion of large globe light fixtures in the Sanctuary to LED.

e. Completion of interior work for removal of the large triangle window in the education building. Estimated cost is \$1,000.

5. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Security and Protection of Church Assets – Emergency and Security Equipment.


Cameras and Wi-Fi. Two additional 120-degree coverage cameras have been purchased and will be installed to monitor the back of the Sanctuary and Social Hall building. Two Blink cameras have been temporarily installed and show there is activity taking place. It is also recommended that three additional cameras be purchased to cover the garden area and the parking lot. This will enable the removal of the remaining older cameras, wires, and conduit mounted on the exterior of the buildings. Estimated cost is \$2,000. Existing camera coverage will continue to be monitored to determine if additional cameras are required.

6. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Church Property and Equipment - Implementation & Facilitation.

- a. Congregation members weekly complete lawn and garden care activities.
- b. There will be a church workday on the third Saturday of each month, from 9 am until noon. Lunch will be provided afterwards.

7. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Miscellaneous - General Responsibilities of The Board - Help plan, implement, and conduct servant projects and encourage continued and increasing participation of congregational members in these activities.

BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship

The responsible and careful management of resources, assets, or responsibilities entrusted to one's care. Going beyond finances to include your time, talents, health, property, and environment. Hmm, let's dig a bit deeper. Personal/Spiritual Stewardship is using one's time, talents, and possessions wisely for the good, often for God or community benefit. So, biblically means to recognize that God owns everything and we are the managers (stewards) of HIS resources. We are responsible to wisely use all to bring glory to HIM. Acting as caretakers of HIS creation and HIS kingdom on HIS behalf. An application of faith in managing everything entrusted to us for HIS purpose.

Let's start with the very first verse of the Bible. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." Gen. 1:1. As the Creator HE has all rights of ownership over everything! TREASURER'S REPORT

2025 is behind us. 2026 is already one month gone, with most of the year waiting for our smiling faces.

For 2025 Trinity had a fantastic year financially. The contributions were \$140,841 more than the expenses. Several items made up these amounts.

Regular collections	\$334,521
Special contributions – stock and estates	219,058
Expenses	<u>(412,738)</u>
	\$140,841

We were very blessed to have a member contribute stock (\$72,817) and 2 deceased members that left a portion of their estates to Trinity (\$146,240). The stock is still being held in our investment account. \$25,000 of the estate money was used to cover a portion of the 2025 deficit. We still have \$121,000 to pay for some more HVAC replacements in January 2026, cover some of the 2026 deficit and set aside some money into the investment account.

Without the 2025 special contributions, we had a \$78,217 deficit. We cannot count on these special contributions.

The 2026 Ministry Spending Plan has a projected deficit of \$40,520. This amount does not include several HVAC systems that are being replaced in January and other projects. We need to plan for the projected deficits and take action to lower it.

You and I can help. We need to increase the weekly contributions. If each family would contribute a bit more each week, we can reduce or eliminate the deficit. Increasing giving by \$800 per week is what is needed. This works out to about \$6 per person that attends the Divine Service each week. We hope some families will give more than \$6 per person since some other families may not be able to give this additional amount.

We are a blessed congregation and together we can meet our ministry goals.

BOARD OF YOUTH MINISTRY

The Middle School Youth met Sunday, 4 January, from 11 am until 1 pm. Eight church youth participated in games and Bible. Lunch was provided at 12:30 pm.

The Senior Youth met Sunday, 18 January, from 11 am until 1 pm. Five church youth participated in games and Bible. Lunch was provided at 12:30 pm.

The Youth Ministry is participating in the LCMS "Practicing Healthy Youth Ministry" (PHYM) project! Our consultant is Blythe Ann Barreto, MA, DCE, Adjunct Professor, Department of Theology and Ministry, Concordia University, St. Paul. We completed the first step, a 10-minute survey completed online by some congregation members. LCMS consultants are reviewing the survey results and will provide recommended actions based on the survey results.

The Board of Youth Ministry includes activities for the following groups. Middle School Youth Group, grades five, six, seven, and eight. Senior Youth Group, grades nine, ten, eleven, and twelve. Young Adult Singles Group, high school graduates to age 26.

The Middle School Youth meet on the first Sunday of the month. The Senior Youth meet on the third Sunday of the month. The Meetings start at 11 am and end at 1 pm. The meetings include Bible study, games, and a light snack. During Confirmation Classes, September through May, the Middle School Youth participation will end at 12:30 pm and will not include a Bible Study as Confirmation Class

starts immediately after the youth meeting. The Senior Youth Group will have their Bible Study from 12:30 to 1 pm.

The Board of Youth Ministry hosts quarterly off-site events for the Middle School Youth Group, the Senior Youth Group, and the Young Adult Singles Group. The meetings take place on a date and at a time determined by the planned event.

Next year will be another busy year for our youth.

We will again have Senior Youth participating in the Concordia Seminary, St. Louis *Vocatio* program. *Vocatio: High School* is a retreat that encourages high schoolers to find God's calling for their lives through experiencing many aspects of the Seminary including worship and devotions, sessions with professors, and even some fun and recreation!

Four Middle School Youth are registered for the 2026 FL-GA District Middle School Servant Event Camp at Luther Springs, Florida. The Event will start Sunday, 28 June 2026.

We will participate in quarterly servant events in our community.

We will be hosting various fund raisers in 2026.


THE DOGHOUSE


