### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

March 2026

In Joel 2:12-13 we read,

<sup>12</sup> “Yet even now,” declares the Lord, “return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; <sup>13</sup> and rend your hearts and not your garments.” Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster.”

The second part of verse 13 may sound familiar. That is because we sing that verse during Lent, and on Ash Wednesday I led a Bible Study on it. It is a verse that I encourage you to memorize.

Let’s start by examining a few words.

The first word is return. In Hebrew the word can be translated as “Change”.

The second word is repent. In Greek this word can be translated as “Change”.

The question becomes what are we to change? Our outward appearance? No. The LORD tells His people, and us, at the beginning of verse 13, “rend your hearts and not your garments.” So it must be our hearts that need to change. It is interesting what the Westcot Old Testament Dictionary tells us about “heart”,

“An Aramaic masculine noun meaning heart, mind, the inner person. This word is equivalent to the Hebrew word *lēbāb* (3824). It is used to describe the entire disposition of the inner person, which God can change (Dan. 4:16[13]; 5:21; 7:4). This inner person can be lifted up in pride (Dan. 5:20) or made low in humility (Dan. 5:22) (p.537).

How does this help us to understand when the LORD tells us, “so it must be our hearts that need to change?”

The final word that may need some clarification is “LORD”. We commonly know that the Hebrew word for LORD is YHWH. This name of God is

often translated as “I Am”. YHWH is literally interpreted as the covenant name that God revealed Himself to Moses at Mount Sinai (Exodus 3:14). It is literally means “He who is present”, “He who will be who He will be”, and “He who causes to be all that is”.

People in Joel’s time might lament loudly and tear their garments as a sign of sorrow and then think that God must hear them without ever letting His Word penetrate their hearts. That is why the LORD continues, “Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the LORD your God”. He does not want His people, including you and me, to just go through the motions of repentance and speak them on Sunday mornings. God wants His Word of Law to sink into their hearts and consciences. He expects that visible signs of fasting and weeping and mourning will be outward marks of an inward sorrow concerning our sinfulness. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 7:10 “godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation.”

True repentance is appalled at sin, because sin separates us from the LORD, the source of life and love. True repentance includes faith in the promised forgiveness of our sins. The repentant sinner turns back to the LORD, confident of His grace as David prays in Psalm 52:1, “Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.”

This is exceedingly great news! In fact, if it were not for faith, it would be unbelievable! To hear YHWH tell us, “Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster” is indeed the Greatest News that we will ever hear on earth, and it is the Greatest News that we can tell all sinners!

## BOARD OF PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

There are six major property management initiatives that require funding outside of the Ministry Spending Plan. They are:

1. Sanctuary Painting, with an estimated cost of \$25,000.
2. Carpet Replacement, with an estimated cost between \$52,000 and \$67,000.
3. Education Building Drain Line, with an estimated cost of \$30,000.
4. Additional stucco repair, with an estimated cost of \$25,000.
5. Exterior painting or sealant of all church buildings, with an estimated cost of \$40,000.
6. Tree removal or trimming, with an estimated cost of \$15,000.

All the above initiatives will be contracted out. We will continue the third Sunday special collection for these Property Management initiatives.

### **Maintenance Initiatives Started or Completed**

1. Removal of the wooden stage in the Social Hall was approved by the Church Council. The wooden stage will be replaced by the portable metal stage that has been stored in the church storage shed for the last twenty plus years. The portable stage is 14 feet wide and 7 feet deep. The portable stage will be cleaned before installation.
2. Repairs to the "Rainbow Room" Sunday School classroom have started. The exposed wall area will be primed, 2 feet of header replaced, and the sheetrock replaced. Then the walls will be repainted.
3. Two more Sanctuary pendant light fixtures will be converted to LED during Lent.

## **Property Management Updates**

### 1. Roof.

Diamond Roof Restorations cleaned and inspected the Silicon Sealant System on Tuesday, 9 December, as required by the warranty. They also repaired areas of the roof sealant system located above the choir loft. Otherwise, they reported that everything looked good. There was no mention of damage to the roof from turkey buzzards. We will continue to monitor the turkey buzzards.

### 2. Sanctuary HVAC.

Heat/Cool settings are adjusted to are 62 for heating and 74 cooling for the Narthex, and 62 for heating, and 75 for cooling for the Sanctuary. The settings were adjusted based on the current levels of humidity in the Sanctuary, 55% and Narthex, 67%. This past week, the average daily run time for the Sanctuary HVAC System was 1.6 hours; Tuesday was 3.5 hours, and Sunday was 3.6 hours. The average daily run time for the Narthex was 1.4 hours resulting in elevated humidity readings since the HVAC System did not run enough to ensure sufficient air exchange to dehumidify the Narthex area. The desired humidity is 55%, with an acceptable range between 45% and 65%, relative humidity above 65% will engender mold and mildew.

### 3. Sanctuary Painting (In-house).

We have completed painting the lower walls in the Sanctuary, the Cry Room walls, and all but a small section of the Choir Room. The Narthex hallway walls are painted. The room next to the Choir Room was painted during the November church workday, sincere thanks to Bruce and Judy Bringman. We will start priming and painting the rest of the Narthex area in January 2026. Please contact Ed Rogers or Bob Hanovich if you are interested in priming and painting the Sanctuary. Priming and painting, except for areas above 12 feet, will be completed in-house.

### 4. Pest Control.

We have contracted with Preferred Pest Control to treat the outside of all structures and any indoor areas where food is stored or prepared on a bi-monthly basis.

## **Ongoing Work or Requirements**

The following work list has been developed per board responsibility Church Property and Equipment - Work Lists.

### 1. Carpet.

The value of cleaning would be removal of dirt, bacteria, and musty smell from the carpet, but stains would remain. Our total carpeted area is around 8,000 square feet, therefore cleaning the Sanctuary and Narthex carpeting would cost between \$2,500 to \$4,000.

### 2. Sanctuary Painting (Contracted out)

Painter recommended by Karl, was on site Monday, 6 October. They looked at the areas in the Sanctuary that require painting. The proposal will include painting the ceilings, approximately 5,000 square feet of surface, the high walls at the front of the church and back to the stained-glass window, the burgundy area behind the altar, and an option to paint the cross. Estimated cost is \$25,000.

### 3. Carpet Replacement

Poppell Flooring was on site Wednesday, 1 October. They are working on their proposal. Options are carpet squares and Luxury Vinyl Plank. Carpet squares cost \$52,280. Luxury Vinyl Plank cost \$67,180

### 4. Education Building Drain Line.

The original church building, built around 1970 and the 1978 addition, the gym area, share a common drain line. The Sanctuary-Social Hall building might also use the same drain line. The plumbers think we might get another two or three years before the pipe becomes narrowed to the point where it will not drain. We will get an estimate on replacing the cast iron with PVC. The drainpipe runs from the front corner, closest to the Meditation Garden, of the Education Building to the utility hole located at the corner of Mercy and Woodley. The cost of drainpipe replacement is \$150 to \$250 linear foot, our run is around 150 feet, therefore, \$22,500 to \$37,500. Looking into reducing the cost by doing part of the work in house.

### 5. Stucco.

Additional stucco replacement and repairs. Four panels, not previously repaired or replaced, require replacement. Estimated cost is \$25,000.

### 6. Exterior Paint/Sealant.

Building exterior paint to seal and protect the stucco surfaces from erosion and wear. Estimated cost is \$25,000.

### 7. Trees.

Trees on the church property will be monitored for damage or rotting. Estimated cost is \$15,000.

## Other

1. Conversion of large globe pendant fixtures in the Sanctuary to LED.
2. Completion of interior work for removal of the large triangle window in the Education Building. Estimated cost is \$1,000.
3. Cameras and Wi-Fi. Two additional 120-degree coverage cameras have been purchased and will be installed to monitor the back of the Sanctuary and Social Hall building. Two Blink cameras have been temporarily installed and show there is activity taking place. It is also recommended that three additional cameras be purchased to cover the garden area and the parking lot. This will enable the removal of the remaining older cameras, wires, and conduit mounted on the exterior of the buildings. Estimated cost is \$2,000. Existing camera coverage

will continue to be monitored to determine if additional cameras are required.

4. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Church Property and Equipment - Implementation & Facilitation.
  - a. Congregation members weekly complete lawn and garden care activities.
  - b. There will be a church workday on the third Saturday of each month, from 9 am until noon. Lunch will be provided afterwards.
5. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Miscellaneous - General Responsibilities of The Board - Help plan, implement, and conduct servant projects and encourage continued and increasing participation of congregational members in these activities.



## BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP

When Jesus spoke about the poor widow who gave her two small coins, He was not delivering a lesson about fundraising or generosity techniques. The scene is quieter and heavier than that. It sits near the end of His public ministry, at a moment when His words have sharpened and His warnings have become more direct. The account appears in Mark 12:41-44, with parallels in the Gospel of Luke 21:1-4.

Jesus is seated opposite the temple treasury, watching people place their offerings into the receptacles. Many gave large sums. Their gifts are visible, audible, impressive. Then a poor widow comes and drops in two small copper coins, together worth almost nothing. Jesus called His disciples to Him. He wanted this moment to be noticed, interpreted, remembered.

At first glance, the contrast seems simple, large gifts verses small gifts, rich verses poor.

But Jesus did not praise the widow merely because she gave sacrificially. He explained why her offering is different "They all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on." The issue was not the amount. It is what her gift represents. This woman did not give from excess. She gave from dependence. In placing her last coins into the treasury, she was not merely displaying virtue, she was exposing vulnerability. She had no backup. No reserve. No safety net. Her offering is in a real sense her livelihood.

What deepened the weight of this scene even more is its immediate context. Just before this moment, Jesus warns against scribes, religious leaders who "devour widows' houses" while presenting themselves as righteous (Mark 12:40).

The widow was not held up as a model for a healthy religious system. She was a victim within a broken one. Jesus did not praise the system that leaves her in this position. He draws attention to faithfulness within it. In that sense, this story is not primarily about generosity, it is more about trust. The widow entrusts her entire life to God without any visible assurance that she will be provided for tomorrow. Her act quietly embodies what Jesus has been teaching all along, seek first the kingdom, do not be anxious, and entrust yourself to the Father. Another unsettling thing here, is that Jesus did not stop her. He did not intervene. He observed.

And soon after, He left the temple and pronounced its' coming destruction. The structure that received her last coins will not stand. This prepares the reader for what comes next in the Gospel.

Jesus Himself will soon give everything, not mere coins, but His body and blood, His life.

Like the widow's offering points beyond itself. It foreshadows a greater giving that will not come from abundance, but from full surrender to God's will.

So, when Jesus spoke of this woman, He was not just teaching us how much to give, He was revealing what faith looks like when there is nothing left to lean on but God Himself. That leaves us with a quieter question to sit with. Do we give God what we can spare, more than just our finances, but our time, our strength, the decisions and choices we make, do we ever entrust Him with all that we actually depend on?

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Church Council wants to keep all members informed of our finances. Here are some notes from the January 2026 finances.

1. January was not a regular month. It had a couple items that were not on the estimated amounts.
  - a. We received a \$50,000 contribution. A real nice boost for us.
  - b. We replaced several HVAC units in the Education Building. Their cost was \$32,785.
  - c. Related to the \$50,000 contribution, we gave \$5,000 to FL/GA District (10%).
  - d. The net amount is a positive \$12,215.
2. The special items accounted for a profit of \$12,215. The "regular" collections and expenses were a negative \$11,036.
  - a. The collections were \$11,036 less than the expenses.

The collections were \$8,280 less than the estimated amounts.

To make a dent in the 2026 deficit we needed the collections to be equal or more than 2025.

- b. We did have another item that was unusual. We cancelled the 1/31/26 event. We had received money for it. Since the event was cancelled, we voided the checks we had written the two people.
3. February will be an unusual month. We cancelled the February 1st Divine Services due to inclement weather. No collections will be recorded. Hopefully the members will make up for the missing Sunday.

It is just the beginning of 2026. One month does not make a trend. We will continue to watch.

## BOARD OF YOUTH MINISTRY

Two youth, one guest, and one parent went ice skating on Wednesday, 28 January. They skated for about 90 minutes. Another ice-skating event will be scheduled later this spring.

The Middle School Youth did not meet on Sunday, 1 February, due to winter weather conditions.

The Senior Youth met Sunday, 15 February, from 11 am until 1 pm. Three church youth and one guest participated in games and Bible Study. Lunch was provided at 12:30 pm.

The Youth Ministry is participating in the LCMS "Practicing Healthy Youth Ministry" (PHYM) project! Our consultant is Blythe Ann Barreto, MA, DCE, Adjunct Professor, Department of Theology and Ministry, Concordia University, St. Paul. We

completed the first step, a 10-minute survey completed online by congregation members. LCMS consultants are reviewing the survey results and will provide recommended actions based on the survey results.

The Board of Youth Ministry includes activities for the following groups. Middle School Youth Group, grades five, six, seven, and eight. Senior Youth Group, grades nine, ten, eleven, and twelve. Young Adult Singles Group, high school graduates to age 26.

The Middle School Youth meet on the first Sunday of the month. The Senior Youth meet on the third Sunday of the month. The Meetings start at 11 am and end at 1 pm. The meetings include Bible study, games, and a light snack. During Confirmation

Classes, September through May, the Middle School Youth participation will end at 12:30 pm and will not include a Bible Study as Confirmation Class starts immediately after the youth meeting. The Senior Youth Group will have their Bible Study from 12:30 to 1 pm.

The Board of Youth Ministry hosts quarterly off-site events for the Middle School Youth Group, the Senior Youth Group, and the Young Adult Singles Group. The meetings take place on a date and at a time determined by the planned event.

Next year will be another busy year for our youth.

We will again have Senior Youth participating in the Concordia Seminary, St. Louis Vocatio program. *Vocatio: High School* is a retreat that encourages high schoolers to find God's calling for their lives

through experiencing many aspects of the Seminary including worship and devotions, sessions with professors, and even some fun and recreation!


