FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Colossians 1:16 tells us

¹⁶ For by Him all things were created, *both* in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things have been created through Him and for Him.

Consider the vastness of the benefits that we as Christians have. "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?" (Romans 8:32). All things! "My God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ" (Philippians 4:19). "All things are yours, whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future — all are yours, and you are Christ's, and Christ is God's" (1 Corinthians 3:21–23).

In the New Testament, there are repeated admonitions to give thanks to God. Thanksgiving is to always be a part of our prayers. Some of the most remembered passages on the giving of thanks are the following:

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).

"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4:6).

"Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men" (1 Timothy 2:1).

The original thanksgiving celebration was held by the Pilgrim settlers in Massachusetts during their second winter in America in December, 1621. The first winter had killed 44 of the original 102 colonists. At one point their daily food ration was down to five kernels of corn apiece, but then an unexpected trading vessel arrived, swapping them beaver pelts for grain, providing for their severe need. The next summer's crop brought hope, and Governor William Bradford decreed that December 13, 1621, be set aside as a day of feasting and prayer to show the gratitude of the colonists that they were still alive.

These Pilgrims, seeking religious freedom and opportunity in America, gave thanks to God for His provision for them in helping them find 20 acres of cleared land, for the fact that there were no hostile Native Americans in that area, for their newfound religious freedom, and for God's provision of an interpreter to the Native Americans in Squanto. Along with the feasting and games involving the colonists and more than 80 Native Americans (who added to the feast by bringing wild turkeys and venison), prayers, sermons, and songs of praise were important in the celebration. Three days were spent in feasting and prayer.

From that time forward, Thanksgiving has been celebrated as a day to give thanks to God for His gracious and sufficient provision. President Abraham Lincoln officially set aside the last Thursday of November, in 1863, "as a day of thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father." In 1941, Congress ruled that after 1941, the fourth Thursday of November be observed as Thanksgiving Day and be a legal holiday.

Of all of God's gifts, the greatest one He has given is the gift of His Son, Jesus Christ. On the cross of Calvary, Jesus paid our sin debt, so a holy and just Judge could forgive us our sins and give us eternal life as a free gift. This gift is available to those who will call on Christ to save them from their sin in simple but sincere faith (John 3:16; Romans 3:19-26; Romans 6:23; Romans 10:13; Ephesians 2:8-10). For this gift of His Son, the gift which meets our greatest need, the apostle Paul says, "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15).

We, like the Pilgrims, have a choice. In life there

will always be those things that we can complain about (the Pilgrims had lost many loved ones), but there will also be much to be thankful for. As our society becomes increasingly secular, the actual "giving of thanks to God" during our annual Thanksgiving holiday is being overlooked, leaving only the feasting. Thanks to God's great grace may we be grateful every day for all of His gifts, spiritual and material. God is good, and every good gift comes from Him (James 1:17). For those who

believe that Jesus Christ was born of the virgin Mary and came to save us from the consequences of sin by dying on the cross, believing that God also works everything together for good, even events we would not necessarily consider good (Romans 8:28-30). May we be thankful as His grateful children not only in November 27 of this year, but also every day that God shall give us life here on earth and into eternity.

The Angel Tree prison ministry has been cancelled this year due to factors beyond our control.

For the MCP, the boxes have been shipped. They should arrive around Thanksgiving and be passed out. Our plans are to post some of the pictures on Trinity's website and Facebook pages.

We will be going through the library in the Social Hall to gather books to place on the table in Novemberfest for free reading materials.

Bombas Socks ministry is going well. We received 50,000 socks and are able to reach out to 39 different agencies to help folks through these various agencies. The order for the 2026 calendar year has already been submitted. We are requesting 200,000 socks for next year. When the time comes, we will be reaching out for assistance.



BOARD OF PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

Maintenance Initiatives

The following property management initiatives are listed in recommended order of priority.

1. Mold Remediation

Stanley Steemer (Restorations Branch) and True North Restoration were on site last week to look at the mold areas of concern in the Education Building. Both organizations are working their bids. One bid was received for \$7,902.

2. HVAC Education Building

Climatech Air Inc provided proposals for the replacement of four HVAC systems. One was for the HVAC system in the activity room in the Education Building. The total cost for Removal & Replacement of the 5-Ton unit is \$9,798. (Climatech Air Inc proposal is attached.)

3. Sanctuary Painting

Stacy Allen, painter recommended by painter recommended by Karl, was on site Monday, 6 October. She looked at the areas in the Sanctuary that require painting. Her proposal will include painting the ceilings, approximately 5,000 square feet of surface, the high walls at the front of the

church and back to the stained-glass window, the burgundy area behind the altar, and an option to paint the cross. Estimated cost is \$25,000 per Stacy.

4. Carpet Replacement

Poppell Flooring was on site Wednesday, 1 October. They are working on their proposal. Options are carpet squares and Luxury Vinyl Plank. Carpet squares cost \$52,280. Luxury Vinyl Plank cost \$67,180

5. HVAC Social Hall

Climatech Air Inc provided proposals for the replacement of four HVAC systems. One was for the two HVAC systems for the Social Hall. The total cost for Removal & Replacement of the two 10-Ton units is \$52,203. (Climatech Air Inc proposal is attached.)

6. HVAC Kitchen

Climatech Air Inc provided proposals for the replacement of four HVAC systems. One was for the HVAC system for the kitchen in the Social Hall. The total cost for Removal & Replacement of the 5-Ton unit is \$9,798. (Climatech Air Inc proposal is attached.)

Property Management Updates

1. Education Building Front Doors McCarty Inc. has ordered the material. I will get an update before church council. Material cost is \$10,000 and labor cost is \$6,000.

2. Roof.

Diamond Roof Restorations inspected and cleaned the Silicon Sealant System on Monday, 28 July. They reported that everything looked good. There was no mention of damage to the roof from turkey buzzards. We will continue to monitor the turkey buzzards.

3. Sanctuary HVAC.

Heat/Cool settings are adjusted to are 62 for heating and 74 cooling for the Narthex, and 62 for heating, and 75 for cooling for the Sanctuary. The settings were adjusted based on the current levels of humidity in the Sanctuary, 55% and Narthex, 67%. This past week, the average daily run time for the Sanctuary HVAC System was 1.6 hours; Tuesday was 3.5 hours, and Sunday was 3.6 hours. The average daily run time for the Narthex was 1.4 hours resulting in elevated humidity readings since the HVAC System did not run enough to ensure sufficient air exchange to dehumidify the Narthex area. The desired humidity is 55%, with an acceptable range between 45% and 65%, relative humidity above 65% will engender mold and mildew.

4. Sanctuary Painting.

We have completed painting the lower walls in the Sanctuary, the Cry Room walls, and all but a small section of the Choir Room. The Narthex hallway walls are painted. We will start priming and painting the rest of the Narthex area next church workday. Please contact Ed Rogers or Bob Hanovich if you are interested in priming and painting the Sanctuary. Priming and painting, except for areas above 12 feet, will be completed in-house.

5. Pest Control.

We have contracted with Preferred Pest Control to treat the outside of all structures and any indoor areas where food is stored or prepared on a bimonthly basis.

Ongoing Work or Requirements

The following work list has been developed per board responsibility Church Property and Equipment - Work Lists.

1. Mold.

There are four areas that have mold in the Education Building that require remediation.

2. Carpet.

The value of cleaning would be removal of dirt, bacteria, and musty smell from the carpet, but stains would remain. Our total carpeted area is around 8,000 square feet, therefore cleaning the Sanctuary and Narthex carpeting would cost between \$2,500 to \$4,000. Replacing the carpet would cost from \$50,000 to \$120,000; because the pews would have to be removed and reinstalled.

3. Education Building Drain Line.

The original church building, built around 1970 and the 1978 addition, the gym area, share a common drain line. The Sanctuary-Social Hall building might also use the same drain line. The plumbers think we might get another two or three years before the pipe becomes narrowed to the point where it will not drain. We will get an estimate on replacing the cast iron with PVC. The drainpipe runs from the front corner, closest to the Meditation Garden, of the Education Building to the utility hole located at the corner of Mercy and Woodley. The cost of drainpipe replacement is \$150 to \$250 linear foot, our run is around 150 feet, therefore, \$22,500 to \$37,500.

4. Other.

- a. Additional stucco replacement and repairs. Four panels, not previously repaired or replaced, require replacement.
- b. Building exterior paint to seal and protect the stucco surfaces from erosion and wear.
- c. Trees on the church property will be monitored for damage or rotting.
- d. Conversion of large globe light fixtures in the Sanctuary to LED.
- e. Completion of interior work for removal of the large triangle window in the education building.
- 5. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Security and Protection of Church Assets Emergency and Security Equipment.

Cameras and Wi-Fi. Two additional 120-degree coverage cameras have been purchased and will be installed to monitor the back of the Sanctuary and Social Hall building. Two Blink cameras have been

temporarily installed and show there is activity taking place. It is also recommended that three additional cameras be purchased to cover the garden area and the parking lot. This will enable the removal of the remaining older cameras, wires, and conduit mounted on the exterior of the buildings. Existing camera coverage will continue to be monitored to determine if additional cameras are required.

6. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Church Property and Equipment - Implementation & Facilitation.

- a. Congregation members weekly complete lawn and garden care activities.
- b. There will be a church workday on the third Saturday of each month, from 9 am until noon. Lunch will be provided afterwards.
- 7. The following actions have been started per broad responsibility Miscellaneous General Responsibilities of The Board Help plan, implement, and conduct servant projects and encourage continued and increasing participation of congregational members in these activities.

The socks have gone to organizations that provide support for the homeless and low-income families, to fire victims, Veterans, orphans, nursing homes, medical facilities, family and children services, churches, and so many other service organizations. The socks will continue to arrive and be distributed, but I will no longer be coordinating the project. Chris Garrettson and the Board of Evangelism are taking on this project. It's been an honor to be part of the Bombas partnership. They are a fantastic asset to our TLC outreach in so many ways. Our socks have been ordered for next year and we asked for the maximum allocation of 200,000 pairs. That's a lot of lifting and moving of 800 boxes. I would like to thank everyone who has helped over the years with the socks in any way. Your dedication is always appreciated.

BOARD OF YOUTH MINISTRY

The Youth Ministry will participate in the LCMS "Practicing Healthy Youth Ministry" (PHYM) project! Our consultant is Blythe Ann Barreto, MA, DCE, Adjunct Professor, Department of Theology and Ministry, Concordia University, St. Paul. The first step is a 10-minute survey completed online. The maximum number of people who can take the survey is 20. I am looking for Church Council members and youth parents to take the survey.

The FL-GA District Youth Ministry Weekend is first weekend of November. We have four Senior Youth who will participate in the High School Leadership Event. The High School Leadership event is designed for youth who want to form lasting friendships, build a supportive peer network, and strengthen their faith in Jesus. Participants will be empowered to actively contribute to their local church and grow in their personal walk with God. And we have nine Middle Youth attend the Middle School Gathering. "Shine," John 1:5, the light shines in the darkness, is the Gathering Theme. Our speaker, Rehema Kavugha, currently serves at Lutheran Church Extension Fund as Director of Synod Relations. Tribe and Tongue will be the house band again this year. We also have six adult chaperones participating.

The Board of Youth Ministry includes activities for the following groups. Middle School Youth Group, grades five, six, seven, and eight. Senior Youth Group, grades nine, ten, eleven, and twelve. Young Adult Singles Group, high school graduates to age 26.

The Middle School Youth meet on the first Sunday of the month. The Senior Youth meet on the third Sunday of the month. The Meetings start at 11 am and end at 1 pm. The meetings include Bible study,

games, and a light snack. During Confirmation Classes, September through May, the Middle School Youth participation will end at 12:30 pm and will not include a Bible Study as Confirmation Class starts immediately after the youth meeting. The Senior Youth Group will have their Bible Study from 12:30 to 1 pm.

The Board of Youth Ministry hosts quarterly off-site events for the Middle School Youth Group, the Senior Youth Group, and the Young Adult Singles Group. The meetings take place on a date and at a time determined by the planned event.

Next year will be another busy year for our youth.

We will again have Senior Youth participating in the Concordia Seminary, St. Louis Vocatio program. *Vocatio: High School* is a retreat that encourages high schoolers to find God's calling for their lives through experiencing many aspects of the Seminary including worship and devotions, sessions with professors, and even some fun and recreation!

We have nine Middle School Youth who are eligible to participate in the 2026 FL-GA District Middle School Servant Event Camp at Luther Springs, Florida. The Event will start Sunday, 28 June 2026.

We will participate in quarterly servant events in our community.

We will be hosting various fund raisers in 2026.



THE DOGHOUSE


