FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On June 8 we will celebrate Pentecost. Pentecost is the Greek name for the Jewish observance of the Feast of Harvest or, as it was also called, the Feast of Pentecost means “50th,” for the feast took place 50 days after the Passover Sabbath. Every Jew tried to be in Jerusalem for the Feast. That Sunday came as it came every year, but God had special events in mind for this Pentecost in 30 A.D. What Jesus had promised concerning the Holy Spirit would now take place.

I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you.⁸ And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹ concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰ concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will see me no longer; ¹¹ concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

¹² “I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³ When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵ All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you. (John 16:7-15)

Jesus had promised, “In a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit” (Acts 1:5). This promise was fulfilled on the day of Pentecost that year. When as Luke tells us,

² And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. ⁴ And they were all

filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. (Acts 2:2-4)

What about us today? Perhaps you first met the Holy Spirit when you were Baptized as an infant. Then, whether you were Baptized as an infant to God breathed faith into you later in life, the Holy Spirit breathed faith into you every time you read, hear and learn God’s Holy Word. In Lutheran Service Book Hymn # 497 we sing,

Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord,
With all Your graces now outpoured
On each believer’s mind and heart;
Your fervent love to them to them impart.
Lord, by the brightness of Your light
In holy faith Your Church unite;
From every land and every tongue
This to Your praise, O Lord, our God, be sung:
Alleluia, alleluia!

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was made available to all who were gathered with Peter and the others on that day. Today, as back then among those Jews gathered outside the house, the Holy Spirit marks the beginning of the Christian faith. No one belongs to Christ without His Spirit (Romans 8:9); no one is united to Christ without His Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:17); no one is adopted as God’s child without His Spirit (Romans 8:14–17; Galatians 4:6–7).

The Holy Spirit is the power for the new life in us. He begins a lifelong process of change as He shapes us to become more like Christ (Galatians 3:3; Philippians 1:6). When we received Christ by grace through faith we began an immediate personal relationship with God. The Holy Spirit continues to work in us to help us become like Christ.

On Pentecost we will pray this Collect,

Almighty and ever-living God, You fulfilled Your promise by sending the gift of the Holy Spirit to unite disciples of all nations in the cross

and resurrection of Your Son, Jesus Christ. By
the preaching of the Gospel spread this gift to
the ends of the earth; through the same Jesus
Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You

and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
Amen.

At your request, Whitaker Laboratory Inc. personnel were on site April 28 2025 to conduct a Limited Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Baseline Assessment for the presence of mold spores within the climate-controlled areas of the Educational Building located at the above referenced address. It is our understanding this assessment was requested and performed as a part of attaining a Baseline Assessment for Indoor Air Quality within the Educational Building where suspect visual topical mold spores have been observed.

During our limited interior reconnaissance, we observed the educational space to be presently occupied with normal ambient climate-controlled conditions appropriately active for the time of year. As such, due to suspect visual conditions, the following six (6) areas were identified by our

technician to receive air sampling for airborne mold spores:

- 2nd Floor 21st Century Parenting Room
- Senior High Classroom
- 2nd Floor Social Hall Area
- Middle School Classroom
- Hallway at the Vestry
- Hallway at the Choir Room

As a result of our visual assessment, we identified the following areas of possible topical mold spore growth concerns:

- Suspect mold spores identified along ceiling beams of the Social Hall
- Suspect mold spores identified along the ceilings of various classrooms
- Suspect mold spores identified along the walls / ceiling of the Vestry
- Suspect mold spores identified along the walls/ ceiling of the Ironing Room
- Suspect mold spores identified along the walls / ceiling of the Choir Room And associated Hallway

Therefore, in accordance with the agreed upon protocol of a Baseline Assessment for this Educational Building, a limited Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) evaluation was performed. The (IAQ) evaluation consisted of the collection and analyses of six (6) air samples from inside the Educational Building - one (1) sample each collected from the following areas:

- 2nd Floor 21st Century Parenting Room
- Senior High Classroom
- 2nd Floor Social Hall Area
- Middle School Classroom
- Hallway at the Vestry
- Hallway at the Choir Room

Additionally, one (1) air sample was collected from the outside air to be used as a "control sample" for comparison.

The seven (7) total collected air samples were then bagged, sealed, tagged and shipped overnight to EMSL Labs, Inc. of Charlotte, North Carolina, (AIHA#192283) a nationally accredited (US EPA) laboratory for analyses of Environmental Microbiology (Fungal) spores.

During this assessment, average temperature and relative humidity (RH) values were obtained for the interior and exterior of the Educational Building were all noted within acceptable limits for commercial climate-controlled spaces and noted as follows in comparison with the exterior sample as obtained:

Interior relative humidity (RH) values registered at the time of our Baseline Assessment appear to be within the acceptable range of values for recognized average interior climate-controlled facilities. Optimum (RH) percentages are generally recognized as being within the range of ($\pm 45\%$ RH to $\pm 65\%$ RH).

CONCLUSIONS:

In consideration of the collected Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) test where measurements were collected, varying levels of mold spores were detected within the specific areas of the Educational Building on the day of (IAQ) ambient sampling. Spore counts from the interior area were noted as ranging between (± 80 to 900 counts/m³).

As well, in comparison with the exterior air quality test, mold spores were detected outside at a rate of ($\pm 5,450$ counts/m³).

From the ambient air tests completed, it can be inferred that the interior air, within these six (6) areas as analyzed, is deemed "acceptable" based on the results of the cumulative spore type indices in each area begin detected at least six (6) to sixty (60) times less than the exterior air counts with a total count of less than (± 1000 counts/ml).

However, from the amount of scattered topical mold spores observed within various areas of the Educational Building combined with the evidence of interior wall and ceiling "de Minimis" staining with material topical damage, it is clear that some degree of active ambient air remediation could be completed in order to address the ambient mold spore counts as identified within this Baseline Assessment.

These ambient air efforts could include, negative air filtration, air scrubbing and drying to combat the ambient air spores as well as the application of mold inhibitors as deemed necessary for any

areas of topical spore contamination revealed in this process which were not identified within this Baseline Assessment.

In order to assist in further lessening the amounts of spores detected within the areas of the Educational Building as examined, it is recommended that your licensed (HVAC) contractor be retained to evaluate the free flow of ambient air and "heppa" filtration within the Educational Building as well as the proper exchange of fresh air to ambient within the areas as measured on the day of sample collection.

As well, several (HVAC) diffusers as well as return air vents were observed with varying amounts of dust, dirt and suspect water staining and/or mold spores. These should all be removed and cleaned if possible. Otherwise, they should be replaced. While these measures are being completed, an inspection of ductwork and distribution lines would also be recommended.

Capacity, "heppa" filtration, relative humidity control as well as comprehensive efficiency should also be evaluated to ensure the (HVAC) equipment is returned to an optimal "peak" efficiency for heating, cooling and relative humidity maintenance.

Additionally, as observed and illustrated within the photographs in the Appendix, even though random areas of the Educational Building only had "de Minimis" amounts of airborne spores detected at this time, staining along random ceiling and/or walls of the Educational Building should also be investigated to ensure that a water intrusion event or (HVAC) condensation issues are not currently "active" within the facility.

Finally, mold spores can persist for long periods of time in the environment and resume active growth during favorable moisture and temperature conditions. Therefore, it is important to remediate any and all areas of visible mold growth, when observed. This would include walls, ceilings and/or visible structural components such as beams and/or exposed structural supports.

As such, please note, regardless of the degree of airborne and/or topical abatement performed, until any and all possible water intrusion, and topically affected interior appointments as well as structural components, if identified, have been treated and and water intrusion I condensation issues ceased, the degree of ambient and airborne mold spore production could have the ability to continue within the Educational Building and may become more prevalent within ambient air as humidity and/or seasons change.

We believe we have prepared this report in accordance with the applicable standard of care necessary and scope of work as requested. It is possible, however, for unknown and/or hidden site conditions to exist that were not revealed during a Baseline Assessment. Please note this report only encompasses the type of material actually tested and/or evaluated, and does not warrant nor guarantee that the entire site is homogeneous in nature.

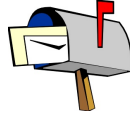


CUB SCOUTS
